

"2022 Kids Division"
Summer Madness Online Tournament

- This is to enrich our member's Summer Madness Online Tournament experience.
- No entry fee.
- Open to any girl or boy age 14 or under and related in some way to the paid lady angler entered into the tournament. (ie, child, grandchild, niece, nephew, cousin, etc.) No need to register -- just take your child fishing and submit the photos according to the rules.
- Fish must be caught while in the presence of the lady angler entered in the tournament. In other words, you must be fishing together.
- The child can be assisted as needed as long as they are involved in catching and landing the fish. **The purpose of this is to get our kids outdoors, involved and excited about fishing. This is just for FUN!**
- Prizes will be a small gift card and a certificate. Only one prize per person and prizes will be awarded in this order.
- **1st – Longest one saltwater fish** (croaker, whiting, sheepshead, sand trout, flounder, speckled trout) – No 1" penalty as in the Ladies Division. Just measure the fish on a Check-it-Stik
- **1st – Longest one freshwater fish** (crappie, perch, bream, sunfish, catfish or bass) – No 1" penalty as in the Ladies Division. Just measure the fish on a Check-it-Stik
- **2nd – Redfish with the most Spots** (any size redfish, both sides, spots must be separated). Must follow state fish size rules so if it is undersized or oversized please photograph and then release.
- Email the photograph to sharon.stewart@swbell.net along with your child's first name and relationship to you. A "designated item" will be posted the night before the tournament begins.
- By emailing the photo you are agreeing that you have the permission of the parent or guardian of the child for them to be involved in the kid's division of this tournament. All fish photos will be posted on our Facebook group page in a separate album using only the child's first name. No photos of the child will be posted by GCLA. However, it is okay for the child's family member to post photo of child holding their fish if they choose.
